



Assisted Voluntary Return and Reintegration from Austria by IOM Statistical Overview 2023


IOM Austria provides return and reintegration assistance to migrants. The support is based on a Memorandum of Understanding that was signed between IOM Austria and the Austrian Ministry of the Interior, and provided in the framework of various projects funded by the European Union and/or the Austrian Ministry of the Interior. Since the year 2000 around 55,000 migrants were assisted in their voluntary return, with a focus on the support of vulnerable migrants. Since 2008 more than 2,500 migrants benefitted from reintegration support.










The total number of 829 migrants assisted by IOM in 2023 must be seen in the context of the strategic realignment by the Austrian Ministry of the Interior, which stipulates that IOM is the responsible organization for the voluntary return of pre-defined target groups, namely migrants in vulnerable situations and migrants with a legal residency status in Austria. Therefore, a comparison with previous years is not accurate and a statistical focus is set on the disaggregation of the caseload by sex, age and type of vulnerability.
